Report of the 3rd Scientific Conference on Project Management, "Clustering in Construction", 24-25 September 2004, Thessaloniki, Greece

Introduction

The CIB co-sponsored 3rd Scientific Conference on Project Management, "Clustering in Construction" took place on 24 and 25 September 2004 in Thessaloniki, Greece.

Below follows a report.

Construction project management is a well developed and accepted domain for professional expertise and academic research and discourse. A number of methodologies and techniques have been developed, covering all aspects of managing projects from their conception to their completion. However, construction project management remains a highly problematical endeavour. A great many construction projects exceed their budget, run late or fail to meet other objectives.

Can this situation improve by the formation of Communication Channels for Academics, Research/Technology Entities and Enterprises in Construction Project Management? This is the topic of the conference!

Conference Aim

The aim of the conference therefore, was to act as a focal point for the dissemination of speculations, needs, research and results in the following (indicative) areas:

- Networking / Clustering between different entities (Universities, Enterprises, Research Centres etc) in Construction Project Management.
- Results from Networking / Clustering attempts in Construction Project Management.

- Applied methodologies in Construction Project Management.
- Construction Project Management in Multicultural and in International Environments.
- Technological and Innovative Applications in Construction Project Management.
- Professional and Continuous Educational programmes and related issues in Construction Project Management.
- Best practices and presentation of successful case studies.
