Introduction

The main purpose of this CIB Co-sponsored 3rd Scottish Conference for Postgraduate Researchers of the Built & Natural Environment (PRoBE), which took place in November 2007 in Glasgow, United Kingdom was to provide an avenue for postgraduate researchers in academic institutions in Scotland, and beyond, to share and exchange research information and knowledge in the areas of the built & natural environment.

It was also intended that the conference would help to enhance research and presentation skills for up and coming researchers. In addition, it provides a forum for postgraduate researchers to debate and exchange ideas and experiences on a broad range of issues related to the built and natural environments.

The event was organised by the School of Built & Natural Environment and the CIB endorsed Student Chapter at Glasgow Caledonian University.

Conference Themes

Of the eighty-five (85) papers initially submitted, forty-seven (47) papers were selected on the basis of the strict review of the International Scientific Committee members to ensure a good quality standard. The papers have come from many parts of the world, including Guyana, South Africa, Ghana, United Arab Emirates, Nigeria, Hong Kong, Canada, Australia, Mexico, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Denmark, Germany, Malaysia, Wales, England and Scotland.

Over 65 Delegates attended the conference.
