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## A changing landscape for building professionals

A qualified workforce is a must to turn the EPBD and the Renovation Wave into a reality, however....

- The construction and building sectors face a number of challenges:
  - ✓ Demographics → shrinking talent pool
  - ✓ Skills shortages/mismatches
  - ✓ Lack of qualified trainers
  - ✓ Lack of attractivity of the sector
  - ✓ Fragmentation of the value chain
  - ✓ Little appetite and time for training
  - ✓ Importance of informal economy
  - ✓ Slow digitalisation


## The Pact for Skills


- Lanched by the Commission in November 2020; first flagship under the EU Skills Agenda
- Stakeholder organisations invited to join forces and take concrete action to upskill and reskill people in Europe
- For a given sector, all members of the Pact sign up to the Charter and its key principles:
  - Promoting a culture of lifelong learning for all
  - Building strong skills partnerships
  - Monitoring skills supply/demand and anticipating skills needs
  - Working against discrimination and for gender equality and equal opportunities
- Pact for skills in construction (EFBWW, FIEC + EBC): "the ambition is to upskill and reskill overall at least 25% of the workforce of the construction industry in the next 5 years, to reach the target of 3 million workers."

## REPowerEU Plan

- To address the skills shortages, the Commission:
  - encourages stakeholders in renewable energy production (solar, wind, geothermal, biomass, heat pumps etc.) and permitting authorities to establish a large-scale skills partnership under the Pact for Skills;
  - will support skills through ERASMUS + and the Joint Undertaking on Clean Hydrogen, with the launch of a large project to develop skills for the hydrogen economy.







## The European Construction Blueprint

- 4-year long stakeholders-led project (2019-2022) funded under Erasmus+
- partnership of VET providers and companies and other stakeholders from 12 Member States: Spain, Belgium, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Lithuania, Portugal, Slovenia, Poland
- sectoral strategy for skills intelligence and labour-market relevant skills development
- improving the sector human capital basis promoting a new generation of digitally aware multi-skilled workers with a focus on 3 key pillars:
  - digitalisation
  - energy efficiency
  - circular economy

## Expected impacts/results

- Analysis of the national status quo + national skills strategies
- New or updated qualification frameworks and curricula
- Innovative **training toolbox**: on-site training, e-learning, blended learning, gamified apps...both for 'blue-collars' and 'white collars'
- Training of professionals at all levels of the European Qualification Framework; Training of trainers (target: >25 000)
- Increase recognition and demand for skills: linking skills with procurement, campaigns towards building owners
- Policy feedback e.g. national long-term renovation strategies;

- Strategy for long-term sustainability of the platform



## LIFE CET Call 2023

- Publication: 11<sup>th</sup> May 2023
- Deadline: 16<sup>th</sup> November 2023
- +/- 100 mEUR available for +/- 55 grants
- policy-driven funding topics with detailed guidance
- Most funding topics: minimum of 3 (eligible) entities from 3 different eligible countries (average number of partners is higher)
- 95% co-funding rate
- Apply electronically via the EC's <u>Funding & Tender opportunities portal</u>





# BUILD UP Skills – Upskilling and reskilling interventions enabling a decarbonised building stock and energy system integration (BUILDSKILLS) Indicative contributions

Objective: increase the number of skilled building professionals

Indicative contribution from the EU:
EUR 1 million - EUR 1.5
million

- Scope 1 Skills supporting Energy Performance of Buildings Directive (EPBD)
- Scope 2 Skills for the decarbonisation of the building stock
- Scope 3 Skills for small-scale renewables and system integration
- Scope 4 Innovative on-site training methods
- Scope 5 Skills for integrated home renovation services (one-stop-shops for homeowners)

**Impacts**: qualification schemes, trained professionals, trained trainers, requalified professionals

Proposals may be submitted by a single applicant from a single eligible country.
